September and October are months of transitions. September starts with the hot days of summer and ends with the beginning of fall. October is full of the changing colors of leaves and the beginning of cool, crisp nights. These are times of the year that reveal the beauty and splendor of God's creative presence in our

world. It is also months of harvest. We see our home gardens finish their growing season and the fields become golden and ready for the harvest.

Harvest is an important theme in the Bible. God told the Israelites how they will harvest the grain and crops from their fields in a way that cares for the poor and also the environment (Leviticus 19:9-10). Jesus spoke not just of a physical harvest but also of a spiritual harvest. Jesus said "the harvest is mending, but the workers are few. Therefore I plead with the Lord of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest." (Matthew 9:37-38)

The church is the "send out workers" of the gospel. God has called us to be sent out into the world and share the gospel of Jesus Christ through loving God and neighbor. 80% of the Hagerstown community does not have a faith community. That means that there is a harvest in your area. There is someone living near you, maybe even your next door neighbor, does not know that God loves them.

The harvest is mending in our community. It's on us, through the power of Holy Spirit, to gather in God's children in Hagerstown and the surrounding towns into a faith in Jesus Christ.

Here's how you can start:

- 1) Pray for the lost
- 2) Read God's word
- 3) Invite someone to church
- 4) Follow up with that person (take them to lunch or coffee) and talk with them about Jesus
- 5) Pray for them
- 6) Go back to step 1


