## Up Coming Adult Florida Work Camp

In October just over a year ago, Hurricane Michael hit the Florida panhandle SE of Panama City. It was a category 5 storm...the first category 5 to hit the US since 1992! It cut a path almost 100 miles wide all the way to the Georgia state line. The damage was extensive and that's where we come in.

Working thru the United Methodist

Committee on Relief (UMCOR), the Alabama-West Florida Conference of the Methodist Church has set up three Recovery Centers. We have reserved the week of March 22-March 28,2020 at the Port St Joe Center for our group. This location has kitchen facilities, showers, and beds. Our work sites should be within 20 minutes of our housing. Our anticipated cost is \$100/person for the week.

We have scheduled a pre-trip meeting for Sunday, February 23, 2020 at our church to share additional information, answer questions, and fill out needed forms.


Please consider this hands-on mission opportunity. We always seem to be of help to folks in need...and have a really good time in the process! If you have any questions, please call or email.



The last few months of 2018 our Leadership stood before you to say that contributions were not enough to cover our operating expenses. Despite receiving a \$10,000 boost in December 2018 contributions, we ended 2018 with a \$5,626 shortfall.

This year we were focused on the roof replacement with our entire goal of \$35,000 met and paid. Additionally we made the tough call to not replace the departing Youth Director with a paid position. Volunteers have stepped up to fill this need. This saved us \$11,600 in 2019 versus 2018.

It is my pleasure to report that 2019 ended with positive operating income of \$1,363.
