Dear First Church Family,

On Sunday, February 7, our SPRC chair, Amy Zetzl, announced that I have been appointed to serve at Churubusco United

Methodist Church in Churubusco, Indiana. This new appointment will begin July 1^s. This news has been a shock to many, and it is quite natural to be sad or upset. It will indeed be hard to say goodbye to all of you when that time comes in the summer. In this letter, I would like to briefly explain why this has happened and how you as a church can move forward.

First, as Amy stated in the announcement Sunday, this change in appointment was not requested by the SPRC or myself, but rather was a missional appointment made by the Bishop and cabinet after much discernment and prayer. Although it will be hard to say goodbye, I have accepted this appointment and believe it will be a good one. As a United Methodist ordained pastor, I believe that God works through the appointment process and the work of the cabinet.

In the United Methodist Church, all ordained elders enter a covenant with one another. Part of that covenant is that we will go where the bishop and cabinet sends us. The cabinet consists of the conference superintendents of our conference. From January through May, the cabinet has many meetings to make church appointments for the appointment year, which starts in July. The cabinet spends time in prayer and discernment as they seek to match churches in need of a pastor with someone whose gifts will match what that church needs. The cabinet has decided that I am the best fit for that church.

So what now? This means that the Bishop and cabinet will now be looking to find a pastor for our church. During this process, our conference superintendent will be in conversation with the SPRC team to hear what attributes they feel our church needs in a new pastor. The input of the SPRC will be taken into account as the cabinet makes their decision. This process could take a while so please be patient. When a pastor is chosen, he or she will meet with the conference superintendent and our SPRC team to make the appointment official. On a Sunday shortly following that meeting, an announcement will be made in church as to who your next pastor will be.

While we are now in a moment of transition, there is still a biblical mandate to advance the Kingdom of God in Hagerstown as it is in heaven. We are called to be the hands and feet of Jesus even while we enter into a season of goodbye and hello. The lost are still in desperate need of rescue, the gospel still needs preached, the hungry and hurting still need to be cared for. My hope is that we will, as I have always encouraged, keep our eyes on Jesus and live out our call.

Treasurer's Report by our Church Treasurer Greta Gustin

The last few months of 2018 our leadership stood before you to say that contributions were not enough to cover our operating expenses. Despite receiving a \$10,000 boost in December 2018 contributions, we ended 2018 with a \$5,626 shortfall.

In 2019 we were focused on the roof replacement with our entire goal of \$35,000 met and paid. We made the tough call to not replace the departing Youth Director with a paid position. Volunteers stepped up to fill this need. Adam left the beginning of August. This saved us \$11,600 in 2019 versus 2018.

In 2020 we had the Covid-19 challenge preventing in-person-worship for much of the year. The Federal Payroll Protection Plan provided \$18,800 which was added to Operating Income to compensate for reduced contributions and cover our payroll expense. The eliminated Youth Director position saved \$18,400 compared to 2019 (\$30,000 vs. 2018).

But the bigger story for 2020 is the difference we made using money donated and spent from Faith Promise and Discretionary Funds. While Adult Work Camp and CAC (Children's' Art Camp) had to be cancelled, the Leadership Table decided to use accumulated funds in Faith Promise to help those struggling with the impact of the Covid-19 virus.

- \$3,000 was donated to the Jefferson Township office to be used as needed for Food Pantry or Utility Bill support for those locally out of work due to Covid 19 shutdown.
- \$2,820 was sent to the Northern Dine Covid-19 Relief Effort to provide emergency grants to tribal communities and organizations to bring food, water, and other emergency supplies to some of the hardest-hit families and communities impacted by COVID-19 across the Navajo, Apache, and Pueblos of New Mexico and beyond.
- \$2,000 went to the Lucille Raines Residence in Indianapolis. Owned and operated by United Methodist Women of Indiana, the men and women, who are residents, are actively engaged in rebuilding their lives from substance abuse. The residence had a special need in 2020 for critical building maintenance.
- \$1,000 was transferred from Faith Promise to the fund for Recharge Meals.
 - \$1,100 cash was donated directly from members and the community for Recharge Meals.

Additionally many members donated food, time, labor and gas to make and distribute these meals. At its peak we fed 130 people a night. \$790 remains along with supplies for future meals when a reduction in the Covid risk allows.

\$1,839 was donated by members for pass-through to the Township Food Pantry.


